

OUR IMPACT SINCE INCEPTION:

Second Stork began when a St. Paul hospital social worker shared a story about a new mother who was discharged without the resources to care for her newborn. The social worker said, "I wish I had a 'magic closet' to give families the essentials they need, but with all the red tape, it's impossible." This inspired our founders to create that "magic closet" and partner with healthcare professionals to support new parents in crisis. Since then, we have been able to make a significant impact.
